support and interact with students are required to complete a mental health awareness training or 48 similar program. In order to promote a positive school climate where all students feel safe and 49 supported, regular education about transgender students will be included in such training. In 50 addition, all school mental health professionals will be trained annually on topics relating to 51 LGBTQ+ students, including their safety and support. Further, every employee holding a license 52 issued by the Board of Education is required to complete cultural competency training, in 53 accordance with guidance issued by the Board of Education, at least every two years. Each 54 55 employee required to complete cultural competency training must complete at least one such training no later than the beginning of the 2022-2023 school year. 56

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ACPS reviews its professional development program annually for quality, effectiveness, participation by instructional personnel, and relevancy to the instructional needs of teachers and the social, emotional and academic achievement needs of students.
