



46 **V. EPINEPHRINE**

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48 Pursuant to an order or standing protocol issued by the licensed prescriber within the course  
49 of professional practice, any school nurse, School Board employee, employee of a local  
50 governing body, or employee of a local health department who is authorized by a licensed  
51 prescriber and trained in the administration of epinephrine may possess epinephrine and  
52 may administer it to any student believed to be having an anaphylactic reaction.

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54 **VI. ALBUTEROL INHALERS**

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56 As addressed in detail in Regulation JHCD-R, albuterol inhalers and corresponding spacers  
57 are stocked in each school to be administered by approved staff members for any student  
58 believed in good faith to be in need of such medication.

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60 **VII. NALOXONE**

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62 Pursuant to an order or standing protocol issued by the licensed prescriber within the course  
63 of his professional practice, any school nurse, other School Board employees or individuals  
64 contracted by the School Board to provide school health services, or an employee or other  
65 person acting on behalf of the School Board who has completed a training program may  
66 possess and administer naloxone or other opioid antagonist for overdose reversal.

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68 **VIII. CODE OF CONDUCT**

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70 Failure by students to comply with all the required elements of this policy and related  
71 regulations may result in disciplinary consequences in accordance with the ACPS Student  
72 Code of Conduct.
