## I. GENERALLY

The School Board approves the inclusion of <u>F</u>family <u>L</u>life <u>Ee</u>ducation (FLE) in the curriculum. The Superintendent shall organize and maintain instruction under <u>FLE</u> instruction is based on the FLE Standards of Learning (SOL) objectives developed by the <u>Virginia Department of Education</u> and curriculum guidelines developed by the Virginia <u>Board of Education</u>, which provide for age-appropriate instructional content.

# II. CURRICULA

## A. High School

The high school FLE curriculum incorporates age-appropriate elements of effective and evidence-based programs on the prevention of dating violence, domestic abuse, sexual harassment, including sexual harassment using electronic means, and sexual violence, human trafficking, and the law and meaning of consent. may include instruction that increases student awareness of the fact that consent is required before sexual activity and age-appropriate elements of effective and evidence-based programs on the law and meaning of consent. ## B. Secondary Schools

The SOL objectives related to dating violence and the characteristics of abusive relations-relationships are taught at least once in middle school and at least twice in high school.

## C. All Schools

The FLE curriculum offered in any school incorporates age-appropriate elements of effective and evidence-based programs on the importance of the personal privacy and personal boundaries of other individuals and tools for a student to use to ensure that <u>he/shethe student</u> respects the personal privacy and personal boundaries of other individuals. The FLE curriculum incorporates <u>age-appropriate</u> elements of effective and evidence-based programs on the harmful physical and emotional effects of female genital mutilation; associated criminal penalties; and the rights of the victim, including any civil action pursuant to Va. Code § 8.01-42.5.

The FLE curriculum *may* incorporate *age-appropriate* elements of effective and evidence-based programs on the prevention, recognition, and awareness of child abduction, child abuse, child sexual exploitation and child sexual abuse.

#### Separate Sessions

ACPS may conduct selected lessons in the FLE program that deal exclusively with human sexuality in separate classes for boys and girls.

A.D. Students with IEPs

The Superintendent or designee shall<u>ACPS</u> provides modified <u>FLE</u> instruction in family life education for students with individualized <u>Individualized education</u> Education Pprograms (IEPs), when needed.

#### **<u>I.III.</u>** INSTRUCTIONAL MATERIALS

The Superintendent or <u>his/her</u>-designee <u>shall</u>-approves all <u>FLE</u> instructional materials <u>used in family life education (FLE)</u>, as well as all materials relating to FLE available for circulation to students through the school libraries or resource and media centers. In addition, K-10 grade-level curriculum guides are posted on the ACPS website.

## IV. STAFF TRAINING

No teacher is permitted to<u>Teachers may not</u> teach any portion of the FLE curriculum unless <u>he/shethey</u> has completed the "Sexuality Education for Teachers" course (or an equivalent course offering, including a blended-learning format) OR <u>has have</u> provided a college transcript that documents successful completion of a similar course.

Additionally, all employees responsible for adapting the Family Life EducationFLE curriculum for students with disabilities shall\_will\_participate in specially designed professional development to ensure that appropriate modifications and differentiation occurs and is integrated into the written curriculum.

# V. PARENT/GUARDIAN INVOLVEMENT

A. "Opt-out" Procedures

All K-10 students shall bereceive FLE instruction instructed in Family Life Education-unless parents/guardians have chosen to exempt them from all or part of the FLE program. Exemption, or "opt-out" procedures, are included in the Welcome Packet and Family Handbook at the beginning of each school year or upon enrollment, and are found on the ACPS website.

#### B. Parent Training

The Division <u>shall</u>-provide<u>s</u> parent/<u>guardian</u> orientation to support understanding of the purpose and design of the <u>Family Life EducationFLE</u> program and its curriculum. Such training and orientation sessions <u>can-may</u> occur in a variety of venues, including the Family and Community Engagement (FACE) Centers, <u>the</u> Parent Resource Center (<u>PRC</u>), PTA/PTSA meetings, <u>in</u> and other contexts.

C. Right of Parental Review

A parent or guardian shall have has the right to review the family life curricula,

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including all supplemental materials used in the program. A <u>complete\_copy of all</u> printed materials not subject to copyright protection and a description of all audiovisual materials is made available through any available parent/guardian portal and kept in of the family life curriculum shall be available in each school's library media center or office and made available for review to any parent/guardian during school office hours before and during the school year.<del>during a designated date and time.</del> The audio-visual materials are made available to parents/guardians for in-person review, upon request, on the same basis as printed materials are made available.

ACPS shall prepare and make available develops a summary of the family life program <u>curricula</u> designed to assist parents/guardians in understanding the program and to encourage parental involvement in the instruction of students in family life education. The summary is distributed to the parents/guardians of students participating in the FLE program and is posted on the ACPS website. Such information shall reflects the curriculum curricula of the program as taught in the classroom. The following statement will be included in the summary: "Parents and guardians have the right to review the Family Life Education Program offered by their school division, including written and audio-visual educational materials used in the program. Parents and guardians also have the right to excuse their child from all or part of Family Life Education instruction."

# H.VI. COMMUNITY INVOLVEMENT TEAM

The School Health Advisory Board (SHAB) shall serves as the community involvement team. SHAB members provide input to staff regarding new instructional and resource materials and changes in to family life<u>FLE</u> curriculum.

## HI. VII. ANNUAL ACPS REVIEW

ACPS' Department of Teaching, Learning and Leadership shall—reviews the FLE curriculum annually. Such The review shall-allows for community input. The Department of Curriculum and Instruction will make available by making the FLE curriculum available for public comment.

The School Board reviews its FLE curriculum at least once every seven years, evaluates whether it reflects contemporary community standards, and revises it if necessary.
