SUMMARY:

Rather than categorizing reading proficiency in broad categories such as *Above Level, On Grade Level, or Below Grade Level,* the reading standards on the Grades 1–5 Elementary Progress Report will provide students and families with information about student proficiency in specific components of the reading process. Similarly, on the Kindergarten Progress Report, five of the standards have been consolidated into two standards that reflect critical foundational reading skills. These changes will create consistency with other content areas in utilizing the progress report as a tool to communicate student proficiency with grade-level standards.

Utilizes word analysis skills and phonetic strategies	(Changed from "Applies reading strategies to read assigned and independent-level text" to align with instructional shifts required of the Virginia State Literacy Act)

- **4 Consistently** demonstrates a high level of conceptual understanding and skills mastery of standards taught this quarter
- 3 Frequently demonstrates concepts and skills of standards taught this quarter

- 1 -- Seldom demonstrates concepts and skills of standards taught this quarter

RECOMMENDATION: The Superintendent recommends that the School Board review the changes to the reading sections of the Kindergarten Progress Report and the Grades 1-5 Elementary Progress Report.

Centering the progress report on critical reading standards focuses caregivers and educators on teaching and assessing high-leverage skills to advance students' reading achievement.
