SUMMARY:

The 2022-23 Career and Technical Education Advisory Committee (CTEAC) Scope of Work will assist ACPS Career and Technical Education (CTE) stakeholders in preparing students for career and college readiness.

BACKGROUND:

The Career and Technical Education Advisory Committee (CTEAC) is presenting the following items for consideration for its 2022-2023 scope of work.

- 1. Increase CTEAC membership to include a Career and Technical Education (CTE) teacher, CTE student, and Special Population areas (Economically Disadvantaged, Homeless, Foster Care, Military, Single Parent, and Unemployed Parent).
- 2. Continue to review and monitor CTE course offerings and provide direction and advice

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- for expanding, changing, and eliminating CTE courses.
- 3. Review CTE Annual Performance Report, Industry Certification test results, and student enrollment data to evaluate the effectiveness of CTE programs.
- 4. Continue increasing awareness of CTE programs by expanding outreach for work-based learning opportunities and program publicity to stakeholders.
- 5. Continue to partner with the Industry Advisory Board.
- 6. Enhancing comprehensive workplace readiness skills.
- 7. Explore scholarship opportunities available to CTE students.
- 8. Strengthen the CTE marketing and awareness campaign to enhance outreach and program publicity to stakeholders (students, parents, businesses, school counselors, etc.).
- 9. Approve a new Local Perkins plan for the 2023-2024 academic year.

RECOMMENDATION:

The Interim Superintendent recommends that the School Board approve the CTEAC Scope of Work.

IMPACT:

A focus by the CTE Advisory Committee on the above recommendations would provide more significant opportunities for ACPS students to graduate ready for careers and college.
