EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS RESPONSE DRILLS

FIRE DRILLS

Each school in Alexandria City Public Schools (ACPS) shall-holds at least two fire drills during the first twenty school days of the school year, in order that students and staff members may be thoroughly practiced in such drillsprepared in case of a fire emergency. During the remainder of the school year, fire drills shall beare held at least monthly.

The principal/<u>designee</u> will-sends a copy of the Virginia Department of Education and State Fire Marshall School Exit Drill Form to the Educational Facilities Department within five (5) days of holding a fire drill.

An emergency operations and procedures plan shall beis developed for each ACPS building. Each teacher must be acquainted with the emergency safety plan that has been developed as it applies to each room in which he/she teaches.

Placards describing the nearest exits, evacuation routes for students and important instructions shall be are posted prominently in each room. A plan for evacuation of any student with physical disabilities shall be is developed and reviewed annually. Parents/guardians of such students will be are notified of the evacuation plans for their child.

LOCKDOWN DRILLS THREAT RESPONSE DRILLS

In every ACPS school there shall are be at least two lockdown and/or "Secure the Building" drills during the first twenty school days, in order that students and staff members may be thoroughly practiced in such drillsprepared in the case of a lockdown situation.

In keeping with the model *School Crisis, Emergency Management, and Medical Emergency Response Plan* developed by the Virginia Board of Education and the Virginia Center for School Safety, ACPS <u>will-uses</u> the <u>following terms:</u>

- "Lockdown" <u>is used in to respond-response</u> to immediate threats of violence <u>inside</u> a school facility.
- "Secure the building" will is be used to when preventing unauthorized entry or exit if there is an external threat in proximity to a school facility.

Each school shall-holds at least two one additional lockdown and/or "Secure the Building" drills during the remainderafter the first 60 days of the school year. Such plans and drills shall be in compliance with the Statewide Fire Prevention Code (Va. Code § 27-94 et seq.). Each school provides the parents/guardians of enrolled students with at least 24 hours' notice before the school conducts any lockdown and/or "Secure the Building" drill. The notice is not required to include the exact date and time of the drill.

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Pre-kindergarten and kindergarten students are exempt from mandatory participation in lockdown and/or "Secure the Building" drills during the first 60 days of the school year. The Superintendent develops procedures to implement this exemption. Pre-kindergarten and kindergarten students participate in each lockdown and/or "Secure the Building" drill after the first 60 days of the school year.

I. Active Threat/Violent Encounter Response Protocol

ACPS <u>will-provides</u> an "options-based" <u>response</u>" <u>training</u> approach to staff and students, <u>based onto be applied to</u> the specific circumstances at the time of the incident. Staff dealing with these events may need to consider different response methods, including lockdown, immediate evacuation, or related life-saving actions.

TORNADO DRILLS AND EARTHQUAKE DRILLS

There will be at least one tornado drill and one earthquake drill every each school year in every ACPS school.

SCHOOL BUS EMERGENCY DRILLS

Each school in ACPS shall-holds a drill in leaving school buses under emergency circumstances at least once during the first ninety calendar days of each school year and more often if necessary.

ALL DRILLS

No emergency preparedness drills will be conducted during periods of mandatory testing required by the Virginia Board of Education.

SAFETY TRAINING

In addition to the drills mentioned above, the School Board provides training to each student and employee at least once each school year on safety procedures in the event of an emergency situation on school division-controlled property.
