 4. Efficient use of energy in construction and operation of school division buildings is a high priority. To the extent permitted by the Public Procurement Act, and in alignment with the City of Alexandria's 2019 Green Building Policy as amended, a proposed project which contain the most energy-efficient plans within an acceptable budget will be preferred. Energy efficiency will be considered in the architectural evaluation. A continuous study of energy use will be maintained by the administration for future planning in new construction.

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- 5. Building design, construction, and operations will promote low maintenance costs and the conservation of energy. These factors will also be given special consideration in the renovation of buildings and outdoor educational spaces. Design proposals for each major construction project, both new and renovations of existing buildings, must meet the criteria provided by the U.S. Green Building Council's Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design (LEED) program.
