What is a Site-Specific Educational Specification?

An "Ed Spec" is a planning document that describes the proposed outcomes of a school modernization or new construction project. It tells us **what**, **how** and **how much** to design and build by:

- Adjusting the <u>approved prototypical High School Ed Spec</u> for this specific project
- Accounting for full Connected High School Network (CHSN) need
- Establishing the types of flexible spaces to be built at the Minnie Howard campus



NOTE: Because this document also reflects community spaces, it is being referred to as the *Comprehensive Program*.

EDT Recommendations

Distribute student supports throughout the building

Balance out the two campuses and supplement, rather than repeat, programs and spaces (i.e King Street auditorium, gymnasium, CTE programming)



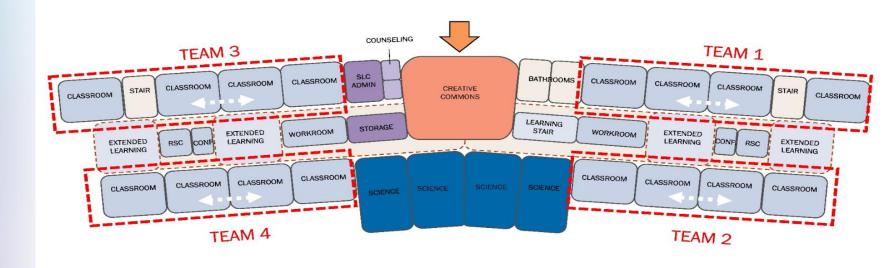

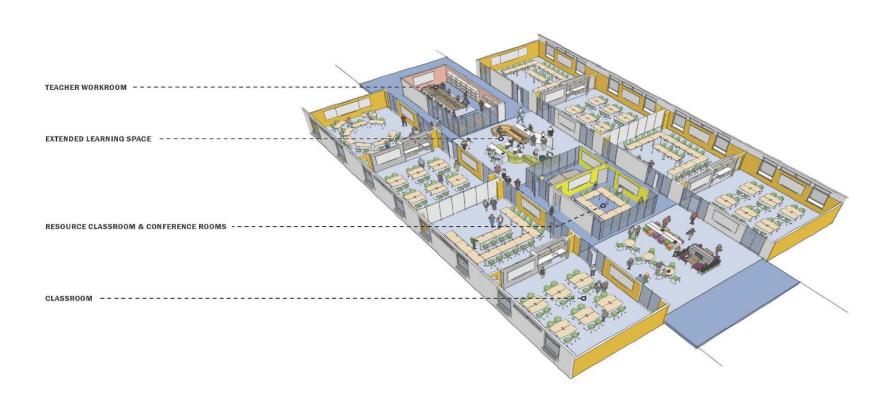




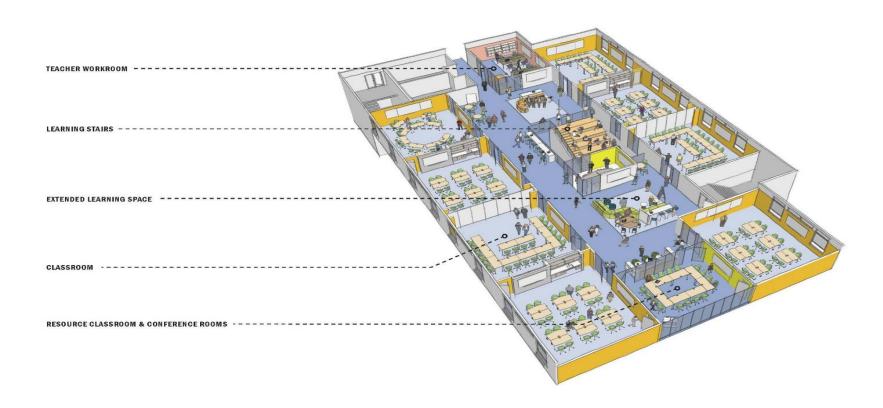

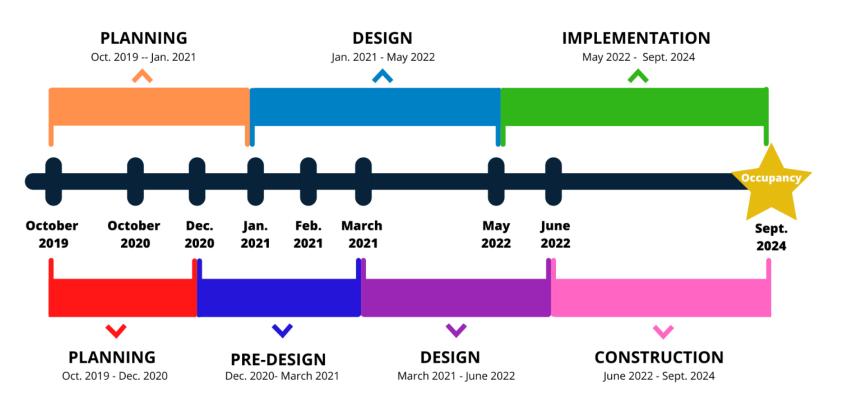
Learning Neighborhood Example

Early Construction Budget Analysis

School Board Costs (Up to \$174M):

- Teaching and Learning Spaces: \$123.2M
- Common Areas and Shared Community Spaces*: \$26.6M
- Pool*: \$14.5M
- Underground Parking*: \$11.9M

Note: School Board Budget for Construction as proposed in FY 22-31 CIP: \$150M

*Potential for Shared Costs with Community users

City Partner Costs (Up to \$6.9M):

Designated Partner Spaces: \$3.6M to \$6.9M (varies depending on size)
