SUMMARY: Using the results of a public survey, the Calendar Committee reviewed the question of a pre-Labor Day start in August 2021. The Committee recommends a start date of August 24, 2021.

The Committee has requested the Superintendent to refine the draft calendar for Board approval in the March/April 2020 time frame. This means the division would publish the 2021-2022 calendar in May 2020.

BACKGROUND: At the December 19 board meeting, the Board approved the study of a pre-Labor Day start in August 2021. A public survey on the question was completed in January 2020 and the results were reviewed by the Calendar Committee. The Committee recommends a start date of August 24, 2021 to better align the school calendar with other divisions in the region. The goal of this effort is to provide a recommendation for Board approval well in advance of the start date to allow staff and families to plan accordingly.

RECOMMENDATION: The Superintendent recommends the School Board review this information pending Board approval of the 2021-2022 calendar.

BOARD BRIEF

IMPACT: The school calendar impacts the division, school community and city. Making this calendar start date decision early in the process will allow the staff more time to schedule changes to school programs, adjust timelines for facilities projects and coordinate operational services impacted by such a change. Likewise, families will be able to better plan their family and student activities.
