15 An Individualized Education Program (IEP) is developed, maintained, and implemented for each 16 child with a disability identified under the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (2004) 17 served by the Alexandria City School Board. The program is developed in a meeting of the child's 18 IEP team, which includes a teacher of the child, parent(s)/guardian(s), the student (when 19 appropriate), a school division representative qualified to provide or supervise the provision of 20 special education services, an individual who can interpret the instructional implications of 21 evaluation results, and other individuals at the discretion of the parents/guardians or school 22 division. This IEP is reviewed at least annually.

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24 Parents of students with disabilities are provided guidance from the Virginia Department of 25 Education regarding the Applied Studies Diploma and its limitations at a student's annual IEP 26 program meeting corresponding to grades three through 12 when curriculum or statewide 27 assessment decisions are being made that impact the type of diploma for which the student can 28 qualify. 29

- 30 The IEP includes areas specified by state and federal statutes and regulations.
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#### 32 **Explanation of Procedural Safeguards**

33 34 A copy of the procedural safeguards available to the parent of a child with a disability is provided 35 students with disabilities and their parents/guardians to as part of identification/evaluation/placement process and for the provision of an appropriate education 36 37 program. A copy of the procedural safeguards are also made available to the parent/guardian of a 38 child with a disability at least annually. The procedural safeguards notice includes a full 39 explanation of all the procedural safeguards available.

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43 The Alexandria City School Board maintains an active and continuing child find program 44 designed to identify, locate, and evaluate those children residing in the division, birth to age 21 45 inclusive, who are in need of special education and related services.
