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THREAT ASSESSMENT TEAMS

In accordance with Va. Code § 22.1-79.4, the Superintendent shall establish a Threat Assessment Team, or "Safety Team," to oversee Division-level threats and those pertaining to multiple facilities. In addition, the team shall oversee individual Safety Teams located at each school. The Division-level team shall include the Chief Student Services Officer, Student Services Support Team Leads, the Chief Human Resources Officer, and the Assistant Director of Health, Safety & Risk Management. It will also include other staff as appropriate.

The Superintendent will has also established a Threat Assessment Safety Team for each school. Teams may serve one or more schools as determined by the Superintendent. The teams will assess and intervene with students individuals whose behavior may pose a threat to the safety of school staff or students consistent with the model policies developed by the Virginia Center for School and Campus Safety including procedures for referrals to community services boards or health care providers for evaluation or treatment when appropriate.

Each school <u>Crisis-Safety</u> Team will include persons with expertise in counseling, instruction, school administration, and law enforcement. Each team will <u>meet once per semester and will review and/or update the following:</u>

- <u>Provide</u> guidance to students, faculty members, and staff members regarding recognition of threatening or aberrant behavior that may represent a threat to the community, school, or self;
- Identify members of the school community to whom threatening behavior should be reported; and
- Implement policies adopted by the School Board:
- Contact information of Safety Team members; and-
- Information provided to staff.

A principal who has received information that a juvenile is a suspect in or has been charged with certain violations of law pursuant to <u>Va. Code § 16.1-301</u> may provide such information to a threat assessment <u>Safety T</u>-team. No member of a threat assessment <u>Safety T</u>-team may disclose any such information or use such information for any purpose other than evaluating threats to students and school personnel.

Upon a preliminary determination that a student poses a threat of violence or physical harm to self or others, a threat assessment school Safety Tteam shall immediately report its determination to the <u>Division-level Safety Team</u>, as well as the <u>Superintendent or Superintendent's designee.</u> including designated school administrators. The school-based administration shall immediately attempt to notify the <u>minor</u> student's parent or legal guardian. Nothing in this policy precludes school division personnel from acting immediately to address an imminent threat.

Upon a preliminary determination by a Safety Team that an individual poses a threat of violence to self or others or exhibits significantly disruptive behavior or need for assistance, the Safety Team may obtain criminal history record information, as provided in Va. Code §§ 19.2-389 -and 19.2-389.1 and health records, as provided in Va. Code § 32.1-127.1:03. No member of a school

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Safety Team or the Division-level Threat Assessment TeamSafety Team shall redisclose any criminal history record information or health information obtained pursuant to this policy or otherwise use any record of an individual beyond the purpose for which such disclosure was made to the threat assessment teamSafety Team.

Each threat assessment Safety Tteam will operate pursuant to the procedures in Regulation EBB-R and will report quantitative data on its activities according to guidance developed by the Virginia Department of Criminal Justice Services.

The Superintendent will establish a committee to oversee the threat assessment team. This committee shall include the Chief Student Services Officer, the Lead Psychologist, the Lead Social Worker, the Director of School Counseling K-12, and the Health Services Coordinator. The committee will also include individuals with human resources and law enforcement expertise.
