# The Identity Project: Report to the School Board Around Community Engagement for the Proposed Renaming of Schools

# Introduction

Many ACPS schools were named during a time in our city and in our country when vastly different attitudes and beliefs guided our decisions. In 2020, a spotlight has shone on the many inequities in today's society and a new determination to right the wrongs of history has swept the nation. To that end, the School Board answered a call to look again at the morality of naming our city's only high school after Thomas Chambliss Williams, a staunch segregationist whose views could not have been more inconsistent with the vibrant, diverse and inclusive place we know today. As that process began, questions were raised about the name of Matthew Maury Elementary School. Was it right to immortalize a commander of the Confederate Navy even though he was also a celebrated oceanographer and astronomer? And so began The Identity Project, a wide-reaching community conversation that allowed for all voices to be heard as we look toward a more equitable future in Alexandria.

During the communications and engagement process, we actively engaged **6,777** via the virtual read-ins, students forums and community sessions. More than **10,366** visits to The Identity Project webpage and **14,000** to all pages within the webpage section over the course of just a few weeks, showed how important the issue was to our community. In addition, there were **7,644** total social media engagements (likes/reactions, retweets/shares, comments, clicks).

# **Student Engagement**

One of the central tenets of The Identity Project was the desire to have our students lead the conversation. In particular, we wanted to hear the voices of our Black and Brown students. We were deliberate in handing over the reins, the direction and the parameters of the engagement with the adults taking a back seat.

Some of the tactics that were employed included:

- School Board student reps managing student engagement.
- Students involved in all planning meetings.
- School Board student reps involvement in the <u>naming and logo design</u> for the T.C. part of the campaign.
- A focus on ensuring Black and Hispanic student voices were involved.
- Three student-lead/student managed Student Forums.
- Student moderators for all 10 of the forums and discussions
- Student takeover of the superintendent's <u>Alexandria Times column</u>.
