The modernization for the entire facility listed in FY 2022 is intended to provide a new or significantly renovated facility and will require additional bus parking. ACPS is currently working collaboratively with the City's Department of General Service and other departments on the Witter-Wheeler Campus Master Plan. The actual project may change based on the results of the master plan, for example, a potential to co-locate ACPS's facility with DASH or other City facilities.

In the interim, ACPS is pursuing a break-room relocatables expansion to increase space and add bathrooms for the Transportation staff.

Samuel W. Tucker Elementary School's boundary was decreased significantly during redistricting; however, due to grandfathering policies for redistricting implementation, all students were allowed to stay which is not allowing for capacity relief at Samuel W. Tucker. Each year, utilization is expected to improve for Tucker as the impacts of grandfathering become less prevalent. Lyles-Crouch and Mount Vernon Community School have capacity projects planned for outside of the ten-year CIP. Charles Barrett also has a renovation proposed in the Long Range Educational Facilities Plan which could be pursued in the future. ACPS is required per policy to review its boundaries every five years, which will allow for ACPS to balance its elementary capacity. In the interim, ACPS can explore adding temporary space to alleviate capacity constraints at the elementary level.

George Washington Middle School is over-crowded and in the future, ACPS may explore an addition and renovation as funds allow at the site. In the interim, scheduling and temporary space could provide capacity relief.

Middle school students across the division average approximately 2-3 days per week outside when the weather allows (roughly Sept. to Dec; March to June). Patrick Henry middle school students will certainly be challenged to obtain that amount for the next two or so years, but creative programming can help alleviate some of this impact. A four-year Physical Activity Plan is currently being created for Patrick Henry and will address methods of having students receive P.E. programming outside as often as possible.

Regarding elementary playground us, there were supposed to be 3 playgrounds on the PH site to accommodate both school and rec center needs. Specifically, one early childhood playground for K and 1st grades on the east end; and on the west end one intermediate playground and one recreation center tot lot. The playground that was designed for the K-1st grade group is on hold until after the swing space is demolished in 4 years.

All of our elementary children will be accessing only the intermediate playground. The tot lot playground is the other playground on the site. The tot lot belongs to the recreation center and is intended for use by the community throughout the day for toddlers and mommy groups. It has smaller equipment.

We have only one playground for the school's use. There is adequate time for all grade levels to use the playground separately for 30 minutes each. However, this will also be included as a part of Mike Humphrey's Physical Activity Plan to establish a physical activity plan to ensure all students receive daily physical activity in a structured environment.

Sites designated for school use through the City's plans also provide an opportunity for partnerships, for example, the Potomac Yard site designated for school use is intended to be co-located with affordable housing.

During the summer of 2019, Phase I of the HVAC replacement was completed which equates to about 40% of the full project. Phase II is scheduled to take place during winter break 2019, spring break 2020 and summer break 2020. \$750,000 is the current estimate to complete the replacement of the Jefferson-Houston HVAC system; however, ongoing evaluation may require additional funding in the future.

The following projects that were identified as Priority 1 in the Targeted Facilities Conditions Assessments were not included in the CIP with reasons associated:

- **Cora Kelly: Roof Replacement** This project was previously funded and work is being completed at this time.
- Francis C. Hammond: ACM Testing and Mitigation This project can be supported through system-wide asbestos and lead remediation funds.
- Francis C. Hammond: ADA Access This project is small and can be supported through existing funding.
- **George Mason: Water Intrusion** This project was reduced in scope based on previous work by staff and in an effort to be fiscally responsible based on an anticipated building replacement.
- George Mason: Miscellaneous Drainage Repairs/Improvements This project will be addressed to an
 acceptable level through existing contracts and funding to maintain the building until its full
 modernization. A division-wide stormwater Best Management Practices (BMP) evaluation was recently
 undertaken and these projects will be addressed through system-wide funds accordingly.
- **George Washington: Storm Drain Cleaning** This project has been previously funded and will be completed in summer 2020.
- George Washington: Miscellaneous Grading and Drainage Improvements A majority of this project will be addressed as part of Site Hardscape Repair/Replacement and Roof Repair/Replacement projects. A division-wide stormwater Best Management Practices (BMP) evaluation was recently undertaken and these projects will be addressed through system-wide funds accordingly.
- Matthew Maury: Music Room Addition Damper and Heat This project will be completed as part of
 ongoing HVAC work in Matthew Maury.
- Matthew Maury: Miscellaneous Drainage Repairs/Improvements A division-wide stormwater Best
 Management Practices (BMP) evaluation was recently undertaken and these projects will be addressed
 through system-wide funds accordingly.
- **Transportation Facility Modernizations** This project was deferred to FY 2022 due to a current joint study on the Witter-Wheeler Campus Master Plan being conducted by the City.
- Transportation Facility: Toilet Room Renovations and Expansion This project was not included due to
 the break-room relocatables expansion being funded out of existing FY 2019 funds due to the previously
 identified urgency of this project.
- **Transportation Facility: ACM Testing** Due to a planned replacement, ACPS intends to support this project to an acceptable level using existing funds until the new building is complete.

Also, please note that the System-Wide Code Compliance line item was increased to account for carbon monoxide detector installation at all schools in FY 2021.
