SUMMARY

ACPS coordinates with multiple advisory committees to enhance educational programming. These committees, which are made up of members from Alexandria business and industry leaders, provide advice to ACPS program staff, principals, and the School Board. As part of The High School Project, ACPS is convening Industry Advisory Boards (IABs) comprised of leaders in industry, business, Higher Education, government, and nonprofit institutions. The IABs will provide input to the Educational Design Team (EDT) on the types of educational programming and work-based learning opportunities necessary to prepare students for success in the 21st-century. The IABs will coordinate with and reinforce the activities of the standing advisory boards.

The chairs have been asked to serve for at least one year and to host quarterly meetings. The desired outcome of the kick-off meetings is to confirm roles and responsibilities, recruiting strategy, focus areas, and next steps. The IABs and Career and Technical Education Advisory Committee will coordinate these efforts.

BACKGROUND

The High School Project began in the summer of 2018 and has progressed steadily throughout the past year. On January 24, 2019, the School Board voted to continue high school project work with a focus on several priorities and a commitment to a multi-option evaluation process. On August 22, 2019, the School Board had a work session that focused on the EDT's models of what a two high schools model or Connected High School Network could look like, as well as a preliminary discussion on the site analysis. The School Board Work Session on September 19, 2019, focused on the detailed site analysis and cost comparison between two high schools model and Connected High School Network. On September 26, 2019, the School Board voted in favor of a Connected High School Network strategy to address Alexandria's future high school capacity needs that included the construction of a high school building (and associated site amenities) on the Minnie Howard campus for 1,600 students.

RECOMMENDATION

The Superintendent recommends the School Board review this and subsequent briefs regularly as a means to stay current with project progress. The project team will respond to and accommodate inquiries from the Board on an as-needed basis.

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
