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Capacity Projects Update

The High School Project

- In FY22 Q4: 100% Construction documents were issued, construction began on April 26, 2022, GMP #2 was released in May
- In FY23 Q1: Sheeting, shoring, mass excavation and utilities began, Final Site Plan and Foundation to Grade permit obtained. GMP #3 released.
- Anticipated in Q2: Approval of Building permit expected, GMP#4 low voltage package expected, steel erection to start in November 2022

Douglas MacArthur

- In FY22 Q4: Foundation walls were completed. Steel erection started. CMU work, MEP work, concrete pour, perimeter framing, and roof decking progressed.
- In FY23 Q1: Steel erection was completed. Slab on metal deck started. Perimeter framing, MEP rough-in, site wall installation, utilities work, waterproofing, fireproofing work progressed.
- Anticipated in Q2: Construction activities including: site wall installation, utilities work, waterproofing, fireproofing work will be continuing to progress.

- In FY23 Q1: ACPS began procurement of planning and design services
- Anticipated in Q2: Planning and design will begin

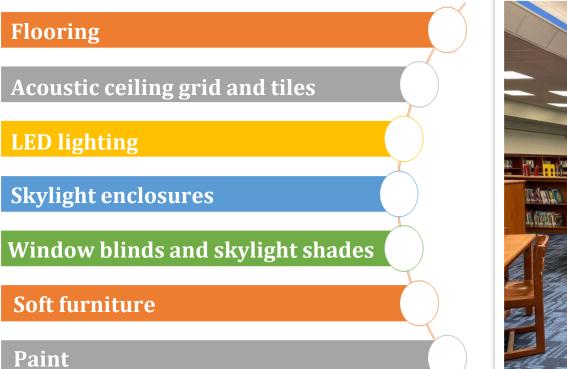
