2018 ACPS Athletic Hall of Fame Nominees

Paul Shu—GW Class of 1935, Football

Paul Shu was a four-sport athlete in football, basketball, baseball and track during high school and was a star player on the Pittsburgh Steelers football team that finished 10-1 for the season. He was a two-time All-Southern Conference football player at VMI, an Associated Press 3rd Team All-American and played in the 1939 Blue-Gray Football Classic. He is a member of the VMI Hall of Fame and Virginia Sports Hall of Fame.

Kelli Flynn—TCW Class of 1990, Track and Field

Kelli Flynn O'Donoghue was a Virginia State Champion for Indoor and Outdoor Girls High Jump, a member of the Washington Post All-Metropolitan Team, an Alexandria Sportsman's Club Athlete of the Year, a district and regional high jump champion, the T.C. Williams record holder in high jump and a member of several 4x4 champion relay teams. She went on to place in the top 5 at the High School National Championships in Baltimore in 1989 and in Syracuse, NY in 1990. She was also a member of the field hockey and cross country teams. Kelli went on to earn a full athletic scholarship to Louisiana State University where she was a member of the 29X NCAA Track and Field program and is listed as #4 on the Women's all-time high jump with a jump of 5' 11 ½" and # 2 on the Outdoor all-time list with a jump of 6' ½".

Karen Bowles—TCW Class of 1986, Basketball

Karen Bowles played on the first TC team to win district and regional Girls Basketball titles and was coached by ACPS Hall of Fame member James Worden. Karen is the 2nd leading rebounder in TC Williams history and averaged 13.2 points per game. She was named to the First All-District and Second All-Regional teams, which included two players that went on to play in the WNBA. She was inducted into the Radford University Hall of Fame in 2013. She was a three-time First Team All-Big South selection and MVP of the 1990 Big South Tournament. She had 1,012 rebounds and 1,072 points in her four years at Radford.

Carl Carr—TCW Class of 1982, Football

Carl Carr was named to the 1981 Washington Post All-Met team, 1981 Touchdown Club, 1982 Parade All- American (linebacker) team, and was named All-Region team, All-Met and All-State in both Indoor and Outdoor Track & Field. Carl's high school football jersey (#58) was retired by T.C. Williams in 1982. He started at linebacker for the University of North Carolina and was drafted by the New York Jets. He played one season for the Detroit Lions.

Earl Quash—GW Class of 1969, Basketball

Earl Quash was the George Washington High School leading scorer in 1968, averaging 13 points per game, and had a 1968 state tournament average of 20 points per game. He led the team to runner up in Virginia State Basketball Tournament and was selected to the All-State team. Upon graduation Earl accepted a scholarship to Little River Community College in Florida, where he averaged 17 points per game his first year and 20 points per game his second. He accepted a scholarship to East Carolina University in Greenville, North Carolina. In 1971-72, he led ECU to the NCAA tournament averaging 10 points per game and in 1972-73, led East Carolina in scoring (13 points per game) when he was selected to the 2nd Team All-Southern Conference.

Eduardo Lopez—TCW Class of 1976, Soccer

Eduardo Lopez was a three-sport letterman in soccer, track and football. He played soccer in the sweeper/stopper full back position from 1973-76. He was selected three times as All-Met, All-Region, All-District, and TCW team MVP. He was an instrumental leader in helping T.C. Williams Titans win back-to-back 1974 and 1975 Northern Virginia Soccer Regional Titles, and 3rd place in 1976, as well as winning the 1976 Bicentennial Invitational Cup. He started participating in track to keep in shape for soccer but found that he loved it. He was part of two T.C. Williams championship track teams. In 1975 and 1976 he was an All-Region and All-District football place kicker under Herman Boone.

Kihlon Golden—TCW Class of 1992, Crew, Cross Country, Indoor Track, Basketball

Kihlon Golden was an excellent student and participated in many sports, some at the same time. He was a member of the Varsity Basketball team (Leading Rebounder and Shot Blocker '90-'92), member of the Varsity Crew Team, member of the state Cross Country Team, member of the state champion Indoor Track Team. He earned a full scholarship for basketball to Bucknell University where he played for four years. While at Bucknell, he twice led the Patriot League in rebounding. He also was an assistant coach at Bucknell.

Steve Osisek--GW Coach and Administrator, Football and Basketball

Coach Osisek was an outstanding basketball and football coach at George Washington High School. He had a major impact on students and athletes, where he taught them the foundations necessary to be successful in life. Coach Osisek served the Alexandria City Public Schools as an administrator and principal for many years after retiring from coaching, including as principal of George Washington.
