The training modules teach individuals to participate in their own survival, while leading others to safety.

GOAL – Safety & Security Services will update and standardize Violent Intruder Standard Procedure and Student Lessons/Drills.

- A Violent Intruder Safety Advisory Committee has been formed. This committee will approve all updated Violent Intruder/ALICE materials used by Elementary and Secondary Schools.
- Committee is in the process of ensuring all grade levels are represented in product development and coordinated through appropriate offices (Curriculum & Instruction, Student Services).
- Draft student lessons and emergency drill scripts have been created and currently under review. Committee plans vote on final lessons and drill scripts by April 2019.
- Committee plans to have ACPS Standard Procedure document finalized by May 2019.
- Committee is requesting opportunity to brief new material and roll-out to all school administrators during August 2019 new-year preparations.
- Safety and Security Services to train all new incoming teachers and personnel before school begins.
- Roll-Out of new student lessons and emergency drill materials to all Elementary and Secondary Schools – beginning September 2019.
