



Reframing Our Work: The Alexandria City High School Connected Network



Needs Identified by Virginia Employers

Personal Qualities and Abilities

- CREATIVITY AND INNOVATION: Employs originality, inventiveness, and resourcefulness in the workplace
- 2. CRITICAL THINKING AND PROBLEM-SOLVING: Uses sound reasoning to analyze problems, evaluate potential solutions, and implement effective courses of action
- 3. INITIATIVE AND SELF-DIRECTION: Independently looks for ways to improve the workplace and accomplish tasks
- 4. INTEGRITY: Complies with laws, procedures, and workplace policies; demonstrates honesty, fairness, and respect
- WORK ETHIC: Consistently works to the best of one's ability and is diligent, dependable, and accountable for one's actions

Interpersonal Skills




Mind Map of IAB Connections

Task: Generate questions we need to answer to develop a plan to connect curriculum and project experiences to workplaces and industries.






Advise ACPS about the world of work and provide resources, capability, funding, and direct supports that are currently not available to the school division.

Prioritizing IAB Scope of Work


Begin to pivot away from virtual resources and start the exciting planning for in-person opportunities in collaboration with the EDT and CTE Advisory Board.


