## Academic Year 2020-21 Quarter 1 Secondary Course Grade Distribution Data

This report summarizes the course grade distribution data at the secondary level collected for the first 39 school days of the current school year 2020-21 (first quarter) compared with the first quarter of last school year (2019-20). The grades reported in the tables and figures that follow are for credit-bearing classes. In the most current school year, the high school is on a $4 \times 4$ schedule (as opposed to a traditional schedule in 2019-20) resulting in fewer courses taken by students in quarter one. In 2019-20 there were 119 additional grades of " P " and 32 in 2020-21.

## Key Findings:

- The largest year-to-year difference is in the percentage of failing (F) grades at the secondary level, which increased from 10\% in 2019 to 20\% in 2020 (see Table 1; Figure 1 by level).
- The ratios of F grades were highest among Hispanic (30\%) and EL (34\%) students with both tripling or near tripling the percentage of F grades in the prior year (see Tables 2a\&b; Figures 2-5 by level).
- There were large observed group differences in the students with 2 or more Ds/Fs by race/ethnicity and program (see Tables 4a\&b). For example, almost 2 out of 3 Hispanic students earned 2 or more Ds/Fs ( $\geq 1$ at high school given adjustment) compared to under $1 / 4$ of White students. More than $70 \%$ of EL students earned 2 or more Ds/Fs ( $\geq 1$ at high school given adjustment) in fall 2020.
- The percentage of students with 2 or more Ds/Fs increased by 16 percentage points at the middle school level (see Table 5).
- More than a third of high school students had Ds/Fs in 2019. Due to the revised $4 \times 4$ high school schedule, methodology was adjusted for 2020 for a more accurate comparison. With this adjustment almost half of high school students (48\%) had a D/F for the first quarter (see Table 5).
- Grade distribution was fairly consistent across subject areas. Almost a quarter of grades in Language Arts, Math, and Science were Fs (see Figure 8; Table 6).
