# **Essential Questions**

#### What is Residency Verification?

Working with families and schools to ensure that ACPS students reside in the City of Alexandria or meet other requirements such as:

- Homelessness/Foster Care
- Non-resident employee student transfers
- Shared housing (Form A/B)
- Kinship Care



As a part of this process, ACPS staff assists families who have been deemed non-residents of the City of Alexandria with identification and registration in the school division in which they currently reside.



#### Why is Residency Verification Important?

- Non-residency impacts a student's ability to access instruction. This may include:
  - Truancy
  - Tardiness



- Physical Wellbeing (i.e., fatigue, increased stress level)
- Residency verification also encourages fiscal responsibility by ensuring that students utilizing ACPS resources are residents of the City of Alexandria.
- Complies with the Admissions Requirement of Virginia Code (22.1-5, 22.1-3, 22.1-264).



## What Efforts Has ACPS Taken to Address Residency Concerns?

- Hired full-time Residency Verification Specialist (RVS) in SY 2016-17.
- Reviewed ACPS policies and Virginia Code related to residency and school admission.
- Completed an internal review of residency verification documentation at each school and gathered stakeholder feedback. (Annually)
- Provided education and support to school registrars at monthly meetings, on-site and remotely. (Ongoing)



## What Efforts Has ACPS Taken to Address Residency Concerns?

- Aligned residency verification strategies with the MTSS model.
- Developed sample letters for school staff to use in cases of returned mail, request for further residency documentation, and withdrawal to provide consistency across schools.
- Established review process for all EL registrations through the Office of English Learner Services that do not initially meet School Board Policy JEC requirements.
- Created a Northern Virginia Truancy Residency Intervention Meeting (TRIM) with 10 area school systems. (Ongoing)



## How Does Residency Verification Fit Within the MTSS Model?

#### **Tier 3: Residency Review**


The RVS begins a formal review and seeks to resolve residency concerns. This process may include additional home visits, school record review, public records review, and conversations with the family and school.

#### **Tier 2: Residency Questions Persist**

School administration requests additional information from the family. Consultation with the RVS may occur. The School Social Worker may conduct a home visit.


#### **Tier 1: Residency Questions Arise**

Building principals, registrars and social workers work with families to verify residency through appropriate documentation.







## What Documentation is Required for Enrollment?

#### <u>Current</u>

- Require mortgage statement, lease or rent receipt
- Require a 2<sup>nd</sup> verification to include an utility bill or property tax (vehicle)
- Shared housing requires residency verification from the City of Alexandria resident providing living space via Form A/B

#### **Proposed**

- Require mortgage, lease or deed with copy of real estate tax
- No longer accept rent receipt
- Expand the 2<sup>nd</sup> residency verification to include seven additional options
- Shared housing requires residency verification from the City of Alexandria resident providing living space and parent/guardian via Form A/B



# Proposed List of Residency Documentation

Category A - one (1) document: Lease agreement Deed (with copy of property tax) Mortgage contract

Category C: □ Lack of Housing □ DSS/Foster Care Services Category B - two (2) supporting documents:



Utility bill (water, gas, electric, cable, and/or landline phone)
Current personal Alexandria City property tax bill/receipt
Mailed letter from a government agency (TANIF, HUD, ARHA, IRS, etc.)
Current pay stub (noting Alexandria address & Virginia tax withholding)
Latest federal/state income tax return
2 consecutive bank statements
Current homeowner or renter's insurance policy

Home visits are conducted as needed if additional verification is required.




## What are the Next Steps with Residency Verification?



- Provide/require completion of a Residency Verification Checklist for all new registrations which outlines residency requirements.
- Provide a Kinship Care Affidavit to increase consistency across schools aligned with School Board Policy JEC.
- Continue training and supporting principals, registrars, social workers and EL staff with residency verification, kinship care, etc.
- Continue collaboration with surrounding localities on residency verification and co-facilitation of TRIM.
