



Unified Planning Process – A New Model


- 3 City-Wide Plans to Improve Outcomes for Alexandrians

Community Engagement in the Gathering Info Phase

• Methods:

- Listening Tour (644 Youth Engaged)
- **Build Your Legacy Workshops** (1,498 people from over 50 stakeholder groups engaged)
- Population-Level Data

• Results

 Engaged 2,117 community members, 88% of which were youth, to learn more about the concerns, hopes, and dreams that Alexandrians have for its young people

- Timeline for implementation (when),
- Performance measurements (why),
- Tactic Owners (who)

To track progress and measure performance, the Plan will use the Results-Based Accountability[™] (RBA) framework

- How Much Did We Do?
- How Well Did We Do it?
- Is Anyone Better Off?

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Each Strategy is intended to be fully implemented within five years of the Plan's endorsement



The Unified Planning Group will continue to meet throughout the implementation phase to coordinate shared strategies

Shared Strategies:

- 1. Provide job readiness, career and employment opportunities
- 2. Engage students and families with supports and services within schools
- 3. Improve and increase out of school learning
- 4. Enhance technical infrastructure and close the digital divide
- 5. Implement integrated collaborative systems that help families and the community support the socio-emotional



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
