**TOPIC:** 2018 Virginia On-Time Graduation and Dropout Rates

## SUMMARY:

This memo and the attached figures are intended to provide the Virginia On-time Graduation and Dropout rates for the 2018 cohort within Alexandria City Public Schools (ACPS). These data were released publicly by the Virginia Department of Education (VDOE) on October 1, 2018 for all divisions across the Commonwealth along with aggregate Virginia rates.

## **BACKGROUND:**

Starting with the graduating class of 2008 the state of Virginia began calculating "On-Time" graduation and dropout rates. The "on-time" rates, reported annually, are the official state recognized graduation and dropout statistics. The Virginia On-Time Graduation Rate takes into consideration student mobility, changes in student enrollment, and the needs of special education and English learners (EL) students. An "on-time" graduate for 2018 is a student who entered ninth grade for the first time during the 2014-15 school year and, in four years or less, earned one of the Virginia Board of Education recognized diplomas: Advanced Studies, Standard, Modified Standard, Applied Studies, and General Achievement diplomas.

Attached, please find two figures capturing the Virginia On-Time Graduation data for 2018 released by VDOE on October 1, 2018. Figure 1 displays ACPS graduation rates reported for all students and by subgroups historically. Figure 2 shows the dropout rates reported for all students and by subgroups within ACPS for the past several years.

## **RECOMMENDATION:**

The Superintendent recommends reviewing the 2018 Virginia On-Time Graduation and Dropout figures for possible planning, procedural, programmatic, and/or budgetary changes.

## IMPACT:

Alexandria City Public Schools saw an overall On-Time Graduation rate of 81% for the 2018 cohort which represented a decrease of two percentage points compared to the previous year. Decreases from the previous year were seen across Hispanic (-11 percentage points), EL students (-11 percentage points), SWD students (-7 percentage points), and Economically Disadvantaged students (-6 percentage points). An increase was seen in the Black student subgroup (+2 percentage points) leading to the highest graduation rate within that subgroup dating back to 2011. White students maintained the highest graduation rate among subgroups at 94% with no change from the previous year.

The dropout rate for all students in the 2018 cohort was 10% representing a decrease of two percentage points compared to the previous year. Dropout rates for Black students showed the greatest decrease (-5 percentage points) and reached a historic low of 2%. Dropout rates across all other subgroups remained largely stable (+/- 2 percentage points) when compared to the previous year.
