37	encouraged to provide evidence to support their perspectives, claims, and assertions. They should		
38	also be encouraged to consider multiple points of view related to a controversial issue, problem,		
39	or decision including why a specific issue may raise multiple opinions and perspectives. Such		
40	critical thinking skills as comparing and evaluating sources, including analysis and evaluation of		
41	potential evidence of bias or propaganda, are essential for dealing with controversial issues within
