Public Health Indicators (as of 5/15/2021)

CDC K-12 SCHOOL METRICS

The CDC have published a revised set of Indicators and Thresholds for Community Transmission of COVID-19 (reported over 7 days) in the CDC's new Operational Strategy for K-12 Schools through Phased Mitigation. These indicators and thresholds can be used to assess the current level of community transmission (low, moderate, substantial or high) and help communities better understand which mitigation strategies, learning modes, and testing are recommended based on the level of community transmission.

VDH also recommends that schools evaluate the transmission in school, or "Level of Impact to School" which is described in the revised VDH/VDDE Interim Guidance for PreK12 Reopening. (www.vdh.virginia.gov/content/up-loads/sites/182/2021/01/Interim-Guidance-to-K-12-School-Reopening.pdf). Schools should continue to implement the five key mitigation strategies (masks, physical distancing, hand hygiene/respiratory etiquette, cleaning/disinfection, and contact tracing in collaboration with the local health department) no matter the level of community transmission.

A school division's capacity to successfully implement mitigation strategies, the level of school impact, AND local community disease data should be carefully factored into school operations plans. The CDC indicators and thresholds serve to inform decision making, but should not solely dictate the decisions that school divisions make to best serve their communities.



Combined Core Indicator, Alexandria City, 5/15/2021


Current CDC Indicator for community transmission of COVID-19:






Core Indicators, Alexandria City, 5/15/2021

Percentage of NAAT (PCR) tests that are positive during the last 7 days**






Secondary Indicators, Alexandria City or Northern Region, 5/15/2021

Percentage of hospital inpatient beds in the region that are occupied by patients with COVID-19‡




Existence of localized community/public setting COVID-19 outbreak§


Student In-Person Demographic Data (1/3)









Reasons for Remaining Virtual

- Concerns about jeopardizing current childcare arrangements
- Maintaining current routine
- Uncomfortable with 3ft social distancing
- Student is excelling in virtual instruction at home
- Awaiting vaccinations for additional community members

- Concerns about disrupting in home services
- Parental concerns about health and safety
- Student not vaccinated
- Fear of student bringing COVID-19 home
