SUMMARY:

Staff are proposing the revision of several policies and regulations. Summaries of the revision, including links to code changes where appropriate, are presented in the Details section. Redline changes and comments are included in the draft policies. These policies have been reviewed for code alignment and VSBA model policy alignment, audited for equity, edited by a team of staff members, and reviewed by the SLT and the Board Policy Subcommittee.

Based on Board feedback, BBBB-R has received two adjustments since the Information presentation on March 21, 2024.

- The time student reps can leave has been changed to 9:00
- If a student representative is going to miss a meeting, they should provide their report in writing to another student representative, who will read the report.

The following summarizes the proposed revisions, details are in the track-changes of the draft policies.

AA - School Division Legal Status

BBBB-R2 - Middle School Student Representatives Regulations and Application

- Clarified attendance and reporting requirements
- Removed the application
- Replaced the MS representatives with a MS listening model using the MS SCA
- Retired the MS regulation

CA – Administration Goals

- Struck duplicative language concerning the coordination of communication within the school system and community

JCE - Redistricting Implementation

JCE-R – Redistricting Implementation Regulations

 Policy and regulation are being retired as the last redistricting implementation is complete. New versions will be created as part of the redistricting process.

JHG/GAE - Child Abuse and Neglect Reporting

JHG-R/GAE-R - Regulations for Child Abuse and Neglect Reporting

JHG-R/GAE-R - Interagency Reporting Agreement

- 5 year review
- Standard Changes
- Clarified that the policy and regulation focus on any child abuse and neglect reporting. As
 currently worded it might be inferred that this was focused on child abuse and neglect by ACPS
 staff. Staff abuse would be covered by Policy GBBA.
- Added a provision that substantial revisions to the Interagency Reporting Agreement will be reported to the Virginia Board of Education.

- The current regulation is the Interagency Reporting Agreement and does not provide a clear process for ACPS staff to follow.
 - The Interagency Reporting Agreement will become a stand-alone agreement between the City and ACPS (not a regulation).
 - Created a new regulation to provide clear child abuse and neglect reporting processes for ACPS staff to follow.

BACKGROUND:

The proposed revisions are part of the Board's ongoing work to provide ACPS with high-quality governance. ACPS has over 400 policies and regulations and has established the target of reviewing at least 100 policies and regulations each school year. Candidate policies for revision are drawn from code changes, changes in the VSBA model policies, the code requirement that policies are reviewed every 5 years, and policies and regulations that have been identified by the Board and/or staff for review.

Drafts of proposed revisions are available for public review as part of the Policy Subcommittee, Board Information, and Board Action processes.

Policies were presented for information on March 21, 2024.

JCE and its regulation, which are scheduled for retirement, were presented for information on February 22, 2024 but were not put forward for action.

RECOMMENDATION:

The Superintendent recommends that the School Board adopt the proposed policy revisions.

IMPACT:

By auditing policies for equity, code compliance, and appropriate guidance the School Board ensures that ACPS has high-quality governance.
