The student passed the course associated with the assessment, and 2. The student meets one of the following: 23 • Failed the assessment by a narrow margin; or 24 25 • Failed the assessment by any margin and have extenuating circumstances that would warrant retesting; or 26 • Did not sit for the regularly scheduled assessment for legitimate reasons. 27 28 For purposes of these criteria, "narrow margin" means a scaled score of 375-399. 29 30 The Superintendent or Superintendent's designee determines what constitutes "extenuating 31 circumstances" and "legitimate reasons" for purposes of establishing eligibility for an expedited 32 retake of an end-of-course SOL assessment. 33 34 35 **Parental Notification** 36 The following conditions apply for students who meet the criteria for an expedited retake of the 37 grade 3-8 SOL assessments: 38 39 1. Parents/legal guardians of students will be notified: 40 • of the opportunity to retake the assessment(s); 41 • that a decision not to retake any or all of the assessment(s) will not impact their 42 child's grade or academic record; and 43 • of the opt-in requirement. 44 45 46 2.
