

ADULT EDUCATION

ACPS shall offer Adult Basic Education Programs to those residents of the school division over the age of compulsory school attendance who are not enrolled in the regular public school program. Additionally, students age 16-17 who will benefit from an alternative high school program may attend Adult Education if they are released from compulsory education by the Superintendent or a designee. ~~and who are functioning below the high school completion.~~

The School Board shall seek to ensure that every adult participating in such a program has the opportunity to pass a high school equivalency examination (e.g., GAIN Test), earn a general educational development (GED) certificate, or a high school diploma. Such programs may be conducted solely by the School Board or through a collaborative arrangement between the School Board and other School Boards or agencies. ACPS may offer additional educational programs for adults. The School Board shall establish tuition and fees.

The documented negative results of a tuberculosis test (PPD) assessment are necessary within the past 12 months if the applicant has traveled outside the United States within the past two years. ~~This test assessment will be required before registration is complete and complete, and students are allowed to enter an Adult Education classroom. Any student is allowed to participate in class(es) which meet more than a single time.~~ The assessment can be based on the following:

- a PPD report
- a report of a normal Chest XRay
- a negative TB Risk Assessment conducted by a medical professional
- a report from a health care provider that the person has had a previously positive PPD, but has completed a 6 to 9 month course of medicines
- a report of a normal blood test called QuantiFERON Gold
