Discipline Data

The following tables summarize discipline data collected for the 2018-19 school year from the beginning of the school year as of January 31, 2019.

Data from summer school were excluded from the report. Both short-term and long-term out-of-school suspensions are included in the data tables. Potential data quality concerns emerged based on a small sample of individual record descriptors and sanction codes. A more in-depth review of current SY 18-19 discipline records is recommended to investigate this topic further.
