SUMMARY:

On Tuesday, March 23, 2021 Lazarus Ministry at St. Paul's Episcopal Church informed ACPS that they will be donating \$5,400 for the purchase of gift cards for families in need at William Ramsay Elementary School. In accordance with ACPS Policy KH and Regulation KH-R, any donation over \$2,500 requires School Board approval. The donation must meet the established standards of acceptance requirements. Those standards and the appropriate responses are detailed below:

ACPS Donation Standards of Acceptance

1. Have a purpose consistent with the goals of ACPS;

The donation supports ACPS students and families by providing access to food resources to our families in need. This donation will aid in supporting our students and families who have experienced changes in their household to include decreases in their household income. The food gift cards will be an excellent resource to further engage and continue to build on the strong relationships with the William Ramsay community.

- **2.** Impose no undesirable, unacceptable, or hidden costs in terms of resources to ACPS; The donation has no identified undesirable, unacceptable, or hidden costs.
- 3. Place no unacceptable conditions or restrictions on the school division or its educational or extracurricular programs;

This donation will place no unacceptable conditions or restrictions on the school division or its educational or extracurricular programs.

4. Not assume that the School Board will accept responsibility for continuing the benefit of or program supported by the donation if or when the funds are exhausted;

Ms. Eboni Whitt, William Ramsay Social Worker, will continue to work with Lazarus Ministry at St. Paul's Episcopal Church through the receiving and distribution of this donation. It is assumed that the ACPS School Board will not have any further action or responsibility related to this donation.

5. Meet any applicable federal, state, and/or local laws and regulations, Board policies, regulations or guidelines associated with its construction or use; and meet any applicable safety standards.

This donation meets all local laws, regulations, Board policies, regulations and guidelines.

BACKGROUND:

The Lazarus Ministry at St. Paul Episcopal Church informed William Ramsay Elementary School of its desire to donate food gift cards for the students and families. The initial contact was made with the school social worker who coordinated the efforts with Principal Mike Routhouska, and the Office of Community Engagement and Partnerships.

RECOMMENDATION:

The Superintendent recommends that the School Board accept the donation of \$5,400 for the purchase of gift cards for families in need at William Ramsay Elementary School.
