- Appointed Head Varsity Boys Gymnastic Coach in 1970; Hired as head Varsity Diving Coach for the swim team in 1980

- 1974 US Presidential Sports Award for Soccer, HS Soccer Coach of the Year by the Alexandria Sportsman's Club

# Donald Riviere—Administrative/Athletic Director—1965-1992—FCH and TCW

- Don Riviere was one of the early leaders in the athletic administration field
- He spent 27 years at three high schools in Virginia.

- Began in Alexandria in 1965 as athletic director at Francis Hammond High School in Alexandria,
- In 1973, Riviere became the athletic director at T. C. Williams High School in Alexandria. Served for 17 years
- Oversaw the consolidation of T. C. Williams, GW and FCH
  - Changed TCW's image from one of poor sportsmanship, weak financial management and viewed as non-competitive, into one of the most respected programs in the state.
  - o Riviere established weekly eligibility cards for the school's athletes,
  - Assisted in developing a \$1 million boat house to serve 200 crew participants,
  - directed district, regional and state track meets,
  - o directed T.C. Williams Invitational Track Meet for many years,
  - o initiated the hiring of athletic trainers for middle schools and high schools,
  - o established athletic training and weight rooms,
  - secured a new all-weather track and new football/track scoreboard
  - o organized/supervised graduation ceremonies for 12 years held at TCW.
  - Riviere was athletic director at James Robinson High School in Fairfax County for three years before retiring (Robinson was the state's largest high school at that time)
- Riviere was a charter member of the Virginia State High School Athletic Directors Association (VSHSADA), the forerunner of the Virginia Interscholastic Athletic Administrators Association (VIAAA).

  - Distinguished Service Award

- Was a regional director on the VSHSADA Board of Directors

- He also provided strong leadership for the Virginia High School League (VHSL),
  - $\circ$  served on the VHSL Executive Committee from 1991 to 1993.
  - In 1995, he was inducted into the VHSL Hall of Fame.

  - Riviere attended his first National Athletic Directors Conference in 1972 the year after the conference was started by the NFHS and was the only Virginia attendee.
  - o Attended every conference until his retirement and several more afterwards, and
  - He was responsible for creating enthusiasm for the athletic administration profession in Virginia.
