SUMMARY:

This memo provides an overview of the Career and Technical Education (CTE) & Workforce Development initiatives in Alexandria City Public Schools (ACPS). It will focus on CTE Annual Performance Report (APR) data, Academy Pathways, grants, Work-Based Learning (WBL), partnerships, and National CTE Month.

DETAILS:

Career and Technical Education (CTE) and Workforce Development provide students with various options to apply academic knowledge and earn the technical skills necessary for the workplace of the 21st century. The instructional program, along with opportunities for industry credentialing, helps students prepare to be college, career, and civic-ready. Students can participate in Work-Based Learning (WBL) experiences where they can apply classroom knowledge.

The CTE and Workforce Development Office has worked extensively with middle and high schools to develop strategies to address student achievement using the CTE competency correlation with state standards. Instruction in CTE courses fosters alignment, rigor, and engagement using hands-on, project-based learning. Within three years, the high school has successfully increased state Annual Performance Report (APR) results by developing School Improvement Plan strategies for meeting state data targets.

CTE courses, WBL opportunities, and high-quality industry credentials support the new High School Project Academy Pathways. By monitoring the workforce needs in the region, CTE continues to offer valuable pathways to ACPS students. Regional partners provide valuable feedback on the industry credentials students can earn and offer WBL experiences with fundamental world skills through hands-on experiences.

February is National CTE Month, allowing ACPS to raise awareness of CTE's role in readying learners for college and career success. It is a time to celebrate the achievements and accomplishments of the CTE and Workforce Development program. Additionally, dedicated Alexandria City Public School partners are recognized.

BACKGROUND:

The ACPS School Board approves the CTE Local Perkins IV Grant every April. The information in this memo will assist the board in gaining an understanding of the CTE and Workforce Development Office's scope of work that guides the development of the grant.

RECOMMENDATION:

A focus by the CTE & Workforce Development Office on the above recommendation would provide more significant opportunities for ACPS students to graduate and be ready for careers and college.
