Public Health Indicators (as of 5/29/2021)

CDC K-12 SCHOOL METRICS


The CDC have published a revised set of indicators and Thresholds for Community Transmission of COVID-19 (reported over 7 days) in the CDC's new Operational Strategy for K-12 Schools through Phased Mitigation. These indicators and thresholds can be used to assess the current level of community transmission (low, moderate, substantial or high) and help communities better understand which mitigation strategies, learning modes, and testing are recommended based on the level of community transmission.


VDH also recommends that schools evaluate the transmission in school, or "Level of Impact to School" which is described in the revised VDH/VDOE Interim Guidance for PreK12 Reopening. (www.vdh.virginia.gov/content/uploads/sites/182/2021/01/Interim-Guidance-to-K-12-School-Reopening.pdf) . Schools should continue to implement the five key mitigation strategies (masks, physical distancing, hand hygiene/respiratory etiquette, cleaning/disinfection, and contact tracing in collaboration with the local health department) no matter the level of community transmission.


A school division's capacity to successfully implement mitigation strategies, the level of school impact, AND local community disease data should be carefully factored into school operations plans. The CDC indicators and thresholds serve to inform decision making, but should not solely dictate the decisions that school divisions make to best serve their communities.



"One student arrived feeling a high level of stress. With support, the student was able to find balance and enjoy the activities planned for the day."


"Students have been enjoying the program and are engaged throughout supports and interventions. Teachers report seeing growth in students that have been attending consistently."

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Principals' Outreach Efforts to Families

School principals worked to ensure that all families understood the learning choice that they made for their child for SY 2021-2022.

To ensure that all parents clearly understood their learning choice, the following steps were taken by school principals + their leadership teams:

- A report was generated from PowerSchool providing each school with a comprehensive list of families' learning choice
- Talking points were generated to support
 Student Support Teams in calling families
- Student Support Teams called each family who selected Virtual Virginia to explain the difference between In-Person Learning and Virtual Virginia



Virtual Virginia (VVA) Updates (1/2)

Outreach	 All schools conducted outreach to families with talking points to ensure division-wide consistency of messaging No guaranteed slot after July 15, 2021, for Fall 2021
Enrollment	 Each school will register students via the VVA Student Information System (Genius) The VVA registrar will work closely with all ACPS schools for student registration and course enrollment
Continued Work	 ACPS Cross-Functional Work Teams will assist with the Virtual Virginia implementation Plans will be developed to provide direct service to Students with Disabilities (SWD) and English Learners (EL)
Special Services	 If a student meets the requirements for participation in the Virtual Virginia program, then the student's IEP or Section 504 team may meet to consider what services are required for the student to participate in the virtual environment Virtual Virginia teachers will partner with the school to implement the accommodations noted








