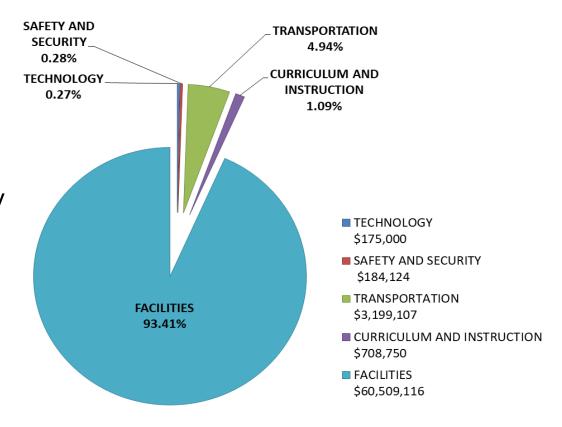

Impact of COVID-19 on Project Delivery



Broadly speaking, COVID-19 is not rendering projects altogether impossible to complete. But it is creating overall disruption to the project process. The most notable impacts ACPS has seen are:

- 1. Contractor Availability: Contractor workforces are being impacted by COVID-19, particularly smaller companies. As contractor employees are diagnosed with COVID-19 (and having to quarantine), they are unable to participate in projects. Further, if they have had recent contact with employees within their organization, others may have to quarantine. This can significantly reduce the number of contractor employees available to work
- 2. Supply Chain: Material supply chains have been severely disrupted for most industries, to include construction. Materials aren't always available to begin projects, which may impact timeline for completion

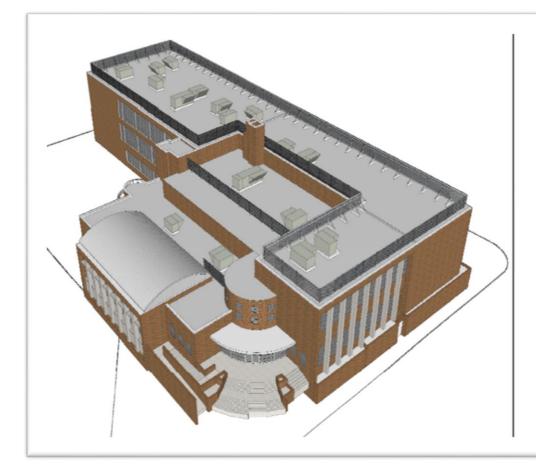
