The meeting was called to order at 6:30 p.m. There were no public attendees.

Public Comment

 Received public comment via email – read at own leisure; community member sent email to division and school board and BAC – asking to consider our recommendations to prioritize on climate issues as relates to budget considerations.

New BAC Leadership for 2023-24

- Nominations and approvals
 - o Ryan Reyna (Chair), Bill Pfister (Vice Chair), Jenica Patterson (Secretary)
 - Motion was made and seconded with unanimous approval of the slate of officers for 2023-2024

Old Business

- Budget Community Forum Meeting for ACPS
 - Recommendation to division support BAC and outreach/promotion to expand membership
 - On website budget page and work with PTAC to make sure it gets into the PTA newsletters through ParentSquare/etc.
 - Event will be webinar with ability to take questions: Monday October 16th 6:30pm in person (ACHS) and virtual;
 - BAC helped create FAQs, and Robert created a public survey about what people wanted to hear – Robert led and had 70 responses

New Business

- Take on a new scope of work to make committee yearlong focus in consultation with school board partners (with Michelle Rief, Kelly Booz)
 - Included a set of recommendations for communications could continue; focused on opportunities for BAC have greater involvement with school board, and school board to work with the city around the investment and strategies moving forward – conversations on going; BFAC-BAC collaboration – more common vision for future of city
 - Two areas for scope of work
 - Rules of engagement for budget process budget calendar when community has opportunity to offer feedback; decision making authority etc.; BAC could see how other jurisdictions engage work with city/county and division and general process for community engagement and resolution; Boards role in budget formulation and how that works in other jurisdictions – do other jurisdictions use add/delete process? Boards ability to change budget after priorities are set?
 - Partnership with BFAAC (City Budget and Fiscal Affairs Advisory Committee); better understand revenue sharing opportunities (ex. collective bargaining, inflation issues) define and understand what happens in other parts of VA can inform joint conversations to work together; how can coalesce disparate conversations on an individual basis to across division; This could be a tenuous situation (both bodies would agree to stay out of each other's way if revenue share agreement (ex. 47-53 sharing) eliminates any discussion for city to transfer funds to schools.
- Q from Bridget about governing body of school: School board is governing body of school staff,
 Superintendent is CEO; in VA school districts don't have tax authority, funding comes from
 city/county; superintendent/staff go through process of formulating budget; fed gov funds –
 title one etc., can be specific funding to schools; ACPS to start highlighting and looking into
 federal grant opportunities to identify opportunities outside more typical federal government
 funds; as well other industry grant opportunities; Family Foundation grants and sign up for alerts
 for grants.gov
 - ***Interest in further exploration for funding for the district (fed grants, industry grants, family foundation, etc.)
- Ryan wants to have few follow up conversations at next meeting before voting officially on scope

Recruitment

- Our bylaws allow us up to 17 members
- Our updated bylaws designated that Board members nominate a representative each and also designated a spot for PTAC
- Leveraging board members to offer recommendations
- Individual community engagement across the city
- Process = Submit an application, conversation with Ryan and participate as an observer before Board approval
- **Leverage PTAC to get flyer out to PTAs and translate into multiple languages

 Oct. 5 – board is voting to adopt budget priorities; school board budget calendar was approved last school board meeting; ACPS budget staff finding key community inputs that could be used to highlight 10-12

 - Budget forum survey with 70 responses based on responses, 3 main topics
 - Teacher staffing decisions
 - How ACPS spends its funds
 - ACPS teacher salaries compared to surrounding jurisdiction.
 - Student enrollment
 - FAQs BAC could help ACPS bolster the information to feed them what are those FAQs
 - Need to bring more awareness of survey to community; make a comms person to make the idea more exciting and bring in ACHS students (gov) to help advocate
 - Community members can submit events through Alexandria Gazette and times to get it on their calendar
 - Focus here on true engagement; division staff to hear from community; have ACPS staff there to help answer questions directly; not only space for answering questions but chance for ACPS to listen to the community;
 - ACPS budget staff to come to PTA meetings to answer specific questions?
 - o Recommend to bring social media to the event
- Start Budget preparation for FY25 next week; information sent out to departments and schools
 to start preparing and look at their budget for next fiscal year; looking to keep a flat budget for
 non-enrollment projections (office supplies, travel, etc.); salaries/benefits are large part of
 budget
