As the parent of two ACPS students (and two more who plan to transfer to public school within the year), I applaud the steps the school system appears to be making toward renaming T.C. Williams High School. It's indefensible the system ever named the school for an avowed segregationist to begin with; it's unconscionable the name has persisted this long. We are way past time to right the wrong and try to repair the damage. Any attempt to delay the decision would be a gross dereliction of your duty to serve the needs of all the city's students. I understand the extraordinary difficulties of planning for a school year in the midst of a pandemic, responding to crises of management and addressing decades—long facility inadequacies. But I submit current events have shown it's no less a crisis that the city's single high school retains the name of a man who fought to keep its schools divided by race. I urge amendment of the motion up for consideration July 10 to include the language to DEFINITIVELY and AFFIRMATIVELY commit to removing the name T.C.
