TOPIC:	Recommendation for Approval of Community Donation

#### SUMMARY:

In May 2022, Alexandria City Public Schools received a financial donation of \$5,000 from Alexandria community member, Ms. Danielle Hagerty to support a career and vocational training space for students with significant disabilities who are in our citywide programs at Alexandria City High School. The Office of Specialized Instruction is planning to officially allocate this donation to support identified needs after the official approval from the Alexandria City School Board.

In accordance with ACPS Policy KH and Regulation KH-R, any donation over \$2,500 requires School Board approval. The donation must meet the established standards of acceptance requirements. Those standards and the appropriate responses are detailed below:

#### ACPS Donation Standards Of Acceptance

1. Have a purpose consistent with the goals of ACPS;

The donation will be allocated to needs identified by the Office of Specialized Instruction in alignment with building leadership, the ACPS 2025 Strategic Plan as well as the Office of Specialized Instruction Plan. Specifically, this donation could be allocated to support, through resources, supplies, equipment and other identified needs in regards to a career and vocational training space for students with significant disabilities who are in the citywide programs at Alexandria City High School.

**2.** Impose no undesirable, unacceptable, or hidden costs in terms of resources to ACPS; *The donation has no identified undesirable, unacceptable or hidden costs.* 

3. Place no unacceptable conditions or restrictions on the school division or its educational or extracurricular programs;

This donation will place no unacceptable conditions or restrictions on the school division or its educational or extracurricular programs.

4. Not assume that the School Board will accept responsibility for continuing the benefit of or program supported by the donation if or when the funds are exhausted;

The Office of Specialized Instruction is committed to allocating this donation and any future donations/support in the future through aligned grants and donations, to identified needs for their students and educational community. The Office of Community Partnerships and Engagement will also continue to assist the Office of Specialized Instruction to identify and pursue additional community funding opportunities.

5. Meet any applicable federal, state, and/or local laws and regulations, Board policies, regulations or guidelines associated with its construction or use; and meet any applicable safety standards.

*This donation meets all local laws, regulations, Board policies, regulations and guidelines.* 

# **RECOMMENDATION:**

The Superintendent of recommends that the School Board approve the community donation in the amount of \$5,000.
