3rd PARTY PROVIDED ONLINE COURSES AND VIRTUAL SCHOOL PROGRAMS

The Alexandria City School Board (Board) may enter into contracts, consistent with the criteria approved by the Virginia Board of Education, with approved private or nonprofit organizations, or other public school divisions, to provide multi-division online learning courses and virtual learning programs. Such contracts shall be exempt from the Virginia Public Procurement Act.

Information regarding Alexandria City Public Schools (ACPS) approved online and virtual learning options provided by 3rd party organizations that are available through the school division will be posted on the division's website. The information will include the types of online and virtual learning options available to students through the division, when the division will pay course fees and other costs for nonresident students, and the granting of high school credit.

 Any student enrolled in any online learning course or virtual learning program offered by the school division must be enrolled in a public school in Virginia as provided in Va. Code § 22.1-3.1. The student's parent or guardian shall give written permission prior to the enrollment of the student in any full-time virtual learning program offered by the school division.

A student enrolled in ACPS who resides in the City of Alexandria is not charged tuition for enrolling in any online course or virtual program offered by the school division. However, tuition may be charged for summer school programs at the same rate as in-person course offerings.

Teachers who deliver instruction to students through online learning courses or virtual learning programs must be licensed by the Virginia Board of Education and are subject to the requirements of Policy GCDA: Effect of Criminal Conviction or Founded Complaint of Child Abuse or Neglect.

The administrator of a virtual learning program must hold an advanced degree from a regionally-accredited institution of higher education with educational and work experience in administering educational programs.

Definitions

For the purposes of this policy, the following definitions apply.

"Multidivision online provider" means (i) a private or nonprofit organization that enters into a contract with a local school board to provide online courses or programs through that school board to students who reside in Virginia both within and outside the geographical boundaries of that school division; (ii) a private or nonprofit organization that enters into contracts with multiple local school boards to provide online courses or programs to students in kindergarten through grade 12 through those school boards; or (iii) a local school board that provides online courses or programs to students who reside in Virginia but outside the geographical boundaries of that school division. However, "multidivision online provider" shall not include (a) a local school board's online learning program in which fewer than 10 percent of the students enrolled reside outside the geographical boundaries of that school division; (b) multiple local school boards that establish joint online courses or programs in which fewer than 10 percent of the students enrolled reside outside the geographical boundaries of those school divisions; (c) local school boards that provide online learning courses or programs for their students through an arrangement with a public or private institution of higher education; or (d) local school boards providing online courses or

programs through a private or nonprofit organization that has been approved as a multidivision 48 49 online provider.

3rd PARTY PROVIDED ONLINE COURSES AND VIRTUAL SCHOOL PROGRAMS Generall

The Alexandria City School Board (Board) may enter into contracts, consistent with the criteria approved by the Virginia Board of Education, with approved private or nonprofit organizations, or other public school divisions, to provide multi-division online learning online courses and virtual learning programs virtual school programs. Such contracts shall be exempt from the Virginia Public Procurement Act.

Information regarding Alexandria City Public Schools (ACPS) approved online and virtual learning options online courses and programs provided by 3rd party organizations that are available through the school division will be posted on the division's website. The information will include the types of online and virtual learning options online courses and programs available to students through the division, when the division willwil pay course fees and other costs for nonresident students, and the granting of high school credit.

Any student enrolled in any online learning course or virtual learning program online course or virtual program offered by the school division must shall be enrolled in a public school in Virginia as provided in Va. Code § 22.1-3.1. The student's parent or guardian shall give written permission prior to the enrollment of the student in any full-time virtual learning virtual program offered by the school division.

A student enrolled in the Alexandria City Public Schools will not be charged tuition during the regular school year for any online course or virtual program offered by the school division.

A student enrolled in ACPS who resides in the City of Alexandria is not charged tuition for enrolling in any online course or virtual program offered by the school division. However, tuition

may be charged for summer school programs at the same rate as in-person course offerings.

However, "multidivision online provider" shall not include (a) a local school board's online learning program in which fewer than 10 percent of the students enrolled reside outside the geographical boundaries of that school division; (b) multiple local school boards that establish joint online courses or programs in which fewer than 10 percent of the students enrolled reside outside the geographical boundaries of those school divisions; (c) local school boards that provide online learning courses or programs for their students through an arrangement with a public or private institution of higher education; or (d) local school boards providing online courses or programs through a private or nonprofit organization that has been approved as a multidivision online provider. Online Learning in ACPS is used to describe online course(s) that are taken in addition to the face to face (F2F) courses. At the high school level, these courses are taken during either the school day or after school. All Virginia students are required to take an online course as part of their high school graduation requirements Virtual Learning in ACPS is used to describe fulltime participation in virtual courses, which ACPS families may request annually. Full-time virtual students remain ACPS students, remain tied to their base schools, and are expected to complete the school year virtually unless the school determines that returning to in-person instruction is in the student's best interest academically.
